





The following chart identifies the number of participants per school district/agency across the county who participated in this assessment survey.









The following chart indicates the Training and Consultation Initiatives identified as needs across the county by those that participated in this assessment survey.






The following chart defines the support needs of School Administrators.




The following chart defines the Behavioral Services needs across the county based on program needs by those that participated in this assessment survey.

Students could benefit from learning coping skills.

Training paraprofessionals before they start on the job working with students. A program that all paras must go through before they enter a classroom.

The lists provided within this survey cover a lot of ground. I don't feel that I could add anything to this list. Implementing these things would be great, especially at the middle school level.

Our students' behavioral needs are excessive (spitting on desks, on students, aggression toward students and teachers, jumping from desk to desk, destroying classrooms...etc) and our administration and guidance counselor are ill-equipped to provide support to classroom teachers. There is no known protocol. Teachers without behavior training are expected to support students and staff. We were told that the administration and the guidance counselor are the last to be contacted and we are expected to contact our encore (music, gym, art, stem, library) staff first. Student learning is disrupted regularly. Behaviors of students continue without efficient and effective interventions.

DeEscalation Strategies

Emotional Support supports, services, and curriculum. At this time, we have a few Emotional Support teachers (I believe one or two) who will pop into classes and run Social Skills groups. It would be nice to have a whole program for the students, or to at least have more than one teacher.

Our district needs to raise the salaries for our paraprofessionals so they can hire more. They deserve more.

Parents and caregivers need to be involved as well.

Preventative lessons from counselors (feelings, emotions,) to all students. Groups meeting weekly for T2 and daily for T3, people being available to assist classroom teacher immediately and students needs being met

High School Emotional Support strategies.

Available services / resources for placements and assistance outside of school for extreme behavioral issues / mental health needs.

Administrative training on how to address teachers who are not teaching to their curriculum

We do not have enough staff/appropriate staff to deal with behaviors. Our school counselor often has to deal with behaviors which is not what she should be focusing her time on. A few disruptive and aggressive children take up the majority of her time.

We don't have the ability to meet ED diagnosed students at the elementary level.

The students need curriculum and lessons based on dealing various traumatic events that have occurred in their lives. Focusing on coping skills and CBT strategies that can be applied to the students' lives on a daily basis is necessary, especially at the high school level.

Emotional support for classes that have many IEP and 504 together.

Additional behavior-trained support staff to model interventions within the classroom or support the teachers so that they can continue to teach the other students as well.

Our biggest issue are students with behavioral issues in the cyber environment because we are limited on what we can provide as support.

Emotional Support services for primary level. If this was in place, we may see a reduction in some behaviors.

Guidance support at each primary building at all times i.e. another guidance counselor.

Having an emotional support teacher and more staff to handle students with social/emotional needs.

- ****An Emotional Support Classroom for K-2 and one for 3-4 would greatly help with the increase in behaviors we are seeing with students. We are seeing a significant increase in students coming in diagnosed with ADHD, ODD, trauma, and other behavioral problems. We have very little support to help these students.
- We have 1 guidance counselor for 700 students (2 buildings share 1 guidance counselor). We need to hire another guidance counselor to help support the behavioral and mental health issues our students are facing.
- We need to have a learning support teacher for each grade level one for Kindergarten, one for 1st, one for 2nd, etc. Currently we share 1 LS teacher for K-2. 3rd and 4th each have their own LS teacher.
- We need more para support than just paras supporting the LS students. We have many lower students who need extra support but are not able to receive extra support/help.
- A closer look at how students qualify for special education a more clear and consistent way of qualifying students for special education.
- More supports offered for our younger learners start title 1 before January. Offer a 'fine motor' club for students struggling in OT since we are limited in OT evaluations. We need to build solid foundations with our youngest learners and get them the interventions but we are very limited with staff.

Teaching parents to parent!

Motivation, organization, time management

Our staff and students need a plan in place to support the behavioral issues for those students who are disruptive, disrespectful, aggressive, etc. We also need to support the other students who follow the classroom rules. They are becoming increasingly anxious and scared of the aggressive students. Even if they are not being physically hurt, they are still being subjected to witnessing these unacceptable behaviors. The increase in the number of these behaviors is impeding the learning of other students while disrupting lessons. Additionally, the same teachers get behaviors every year, while other teachers never experience these behaviors in their classrooms. Consequences need to be enforced and consistent.

Support that would be less embarrassing for students and more supportive of social emotional learning. Support that would be consistent and appropriate, but not fully rest only on the classroom teacher's shoulders if needs arise above the classroom level.

I have received feedback from parents of students who are bullied or struggling socially, stating that it would be more beneficial to have the bullies participate in groups and interventions, rather than offering support to the victims of bullying. I would like resources or input on how to begin and incorporate such approaches, if they exist. I liked this input, as it was more preventative and did not just address the behavior/discipline.

I would like teachers to be more involved in the IU and to know more about what they do/offer.

County-wide trainings led by expert teachers in a variety of subject areas (ie: music teachers go to one school and are led by a music teacher through a music training, science teachers go to another school and are led by a science teacher through a science training, etc.)

Emotional/behavioral support

Mental health resources for our students. Behavior supports in place for our students. Additional paraprofessionals, special education teachers, BCBA, and other in-house people for our students.

I feel like the regular education teachers are not well equipped to manage and understand students with Autism.

Overall, more staff is needed. There are many students who need emotional/ behavior support. Most times the special education teachers and paras are the ones who support this. If a student is having a behavior this interrupts the support that our other students may get.

- Create an Emotional Support K-2 program
- Hire another guidance counselor for K-4
- Hire more Learning support teachers per K-2 grade levels.
- Hire more OT and speech and language staff
- Hire more paras

We need more science and steels training

More emotional behavior supports. There are multiple incidents of students with escalating behaviors, and there aren't enough staff to help support them. Additional help in the Learning Support setting should be expanded as well. More students are qualifying into Learning Support, and the amount of time students are being supported in the general education setting has decreased, due to the Learning Support teachers splitting time between multiple classrooms.

I liked the Beaver County-wide In-Service Day. We could all use a day of mental health services and relaxation for staff.
