









The following chart indicates the Training and Consultation Initiatives identified as needs across the county by those that participated in this assessment survey.


The following chart defines the support needs of School Administrators.




The following chart defines the Behavioral Services needs across the county based on program needs by those that participated in this assessment survey.

The following chart defines the overall knowledge of the IU Trainers and Facilitators related to Professional Development based off participant responses in the assessment survey.




The following are the Future Professional Development suggestions that the IU currently does not offer that the respondents entered in the survey.

TACT-2

This is my 18th year teaching, and up until this point I've only had one suicidal student in my career. This year alone, I've sent four third-graders to crisis for suicidal ideation and threats. The depression, anxiety, and feelings of despair are at an all time high. The students here are crying for help. Our one counselor is a superhero and is doing his best to support the needs of 460 students in one building. We have a SAP program with one prevention specialist. The mental health needs of our students is immense.

The following are the Expanded Supports that the respondents suggested in the survey.

Behavior support

Training on Autism for special education and general education teachers

Social Skills training for all settings

More SLP training

Counseling and emotional support specialists

We need more human resources. We need 2 math intervention teachers. We need more special Ed teachers and more special Ed aides. We need special Ed aides who have training and education (in the field of education) to be able to serve students effectively.

A better discipline system with a tiered system in which students and parents are all aware that if, for example, a physical act of violence is done by a student, then the consequence will be XYZ. There are going to be gray areas always, but there isn't consistency in the discipline and behavioral acts that students do in our schools. Parents complain that they don't have the ability for their child to be suspended because no one will be able to be home to watch them, so they end up getting fewer days suspended.
