









The following chart indicates the Training and Consultation Initiatives identified as needs across the county by those that participated in this assessment survey.






The following chart defines the support needs of School Administrators.




The following chart defines the Behavioral Services needs across the county based on program needs by those that participated in this assessment survey.

In all of my time working with students and families, It is not about "reduction of ______behaviors," but about promoting the behaviors that you want to see more. I find that students generally respond well to positive reinforcement, but since they are most often coming from a home environment that does not promote the structure, relationship boundaries and social supports they need to move from mere survival to thriving, their learning and cognition is severely impacted. I would like to either administer, or have access to assessments, so that I know what interventions the student can understand vs. those that they may not actually understand due to processing delays or cognitive limitations.

As a cyber school, our population is lacking in services to families such as home visits/social services in person. It is very hard to address many needs in a cyber setting.
